Laboratory Procedures

1-Palmitoyl-2-oleoyl-sn-glycero-3-PG (POPG) (sodium salt) is supplied as a crystalline solid. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the POPG (sodium salt) in the solvent of choice, which should be purged with an inert gas. POPG (sodium salt) is soluble in chloroform at a concentration of approximately 2 mg/ml.

Description

POPG is a phospholipid containing palimitoyl (16:0) and oleoyl (18:1) acyl substituents at the sn-1 and sn-2 positions, respectively. This mixed chain phosphatidylglycerol has been used to generate lipid membrane bilayers with controlled permeability and may be useful for various surfactant applications.¹⁻²
