Laboratory Procedures

N-desmethyl-Doxylamine (succinate) is supplied as a solid. A stock solution may be made by dissolving the N-desmethyl-doxylamine (succinate) in the solvent of choice, which should be purged with an inert gas. N-desmethyl-Doxylamine (succinate) is soluble in organic solvents such as ethanol, DMSO, and dimethyl formamide. The solubility of N-desmethyl-doxylamine (succinate) in these solvents is approximately 5, 3, and 10 mg/ml, respectively.

Further dilutions of the stock solution into aqueous buffers or isotonic saline should be made prior to performing biological experiments. Ensure that the residual amount of organic solvent is insignificant, since organic solvents may have physiological effects at low concentrations. Organic solvent-free aqueous solutions of N-desmethyl-doxylamine (succinate) can be prepared by directly dissolving the solid in aqueous buffers. The solubility of N-desmethyl-doxylamine (succinate) in PBS (pH 7.2) is approximately 3 mg/ml. We do not recommend storing the aqueous solution for more than one day.

Description

N-desmethyl-Doxylamine is a metabolite of the antihistamine doxylamine.¹
